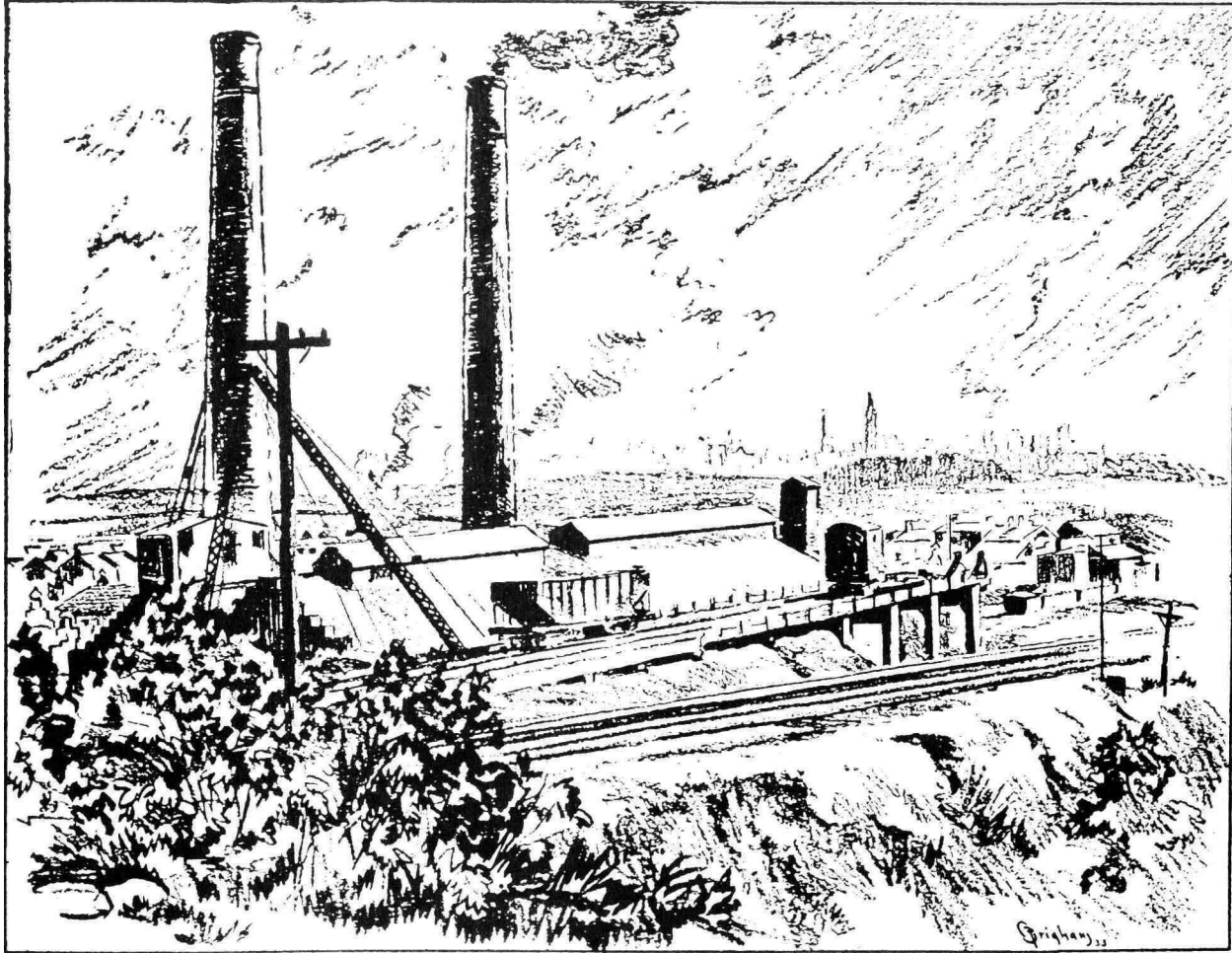


## DUPONTS FROM THE RAILROAD



**O**NE of the reasons for the comparative prosperity of Keamy and its citizens is the Arlington Works of the DuPont de Nemours Company. Paying as it does, a large tax on its huge property holdings and employing hundreds of residents of the town, the Arlington Works has always been a strong factor in the town's well being. It is one of the oldest factories in town, having been here for forty-seven years. For many years the plant was privately owned and was known as the Arlington Company. In 1916

it was purchased by the DuPonts and greatly enlarged in capacity, output and number of people employed. One of the interesting features of the huge plant is its private fire department under the direction of Charles W. Greenfield, former Volunteer Chief of the Keamy Fire Department. Its modern equipment and organization has served as a model for other industrial plants throughout the country. Fire destruction has been minimized by the erection of numerous small buildings for the storage of inflammable material.
